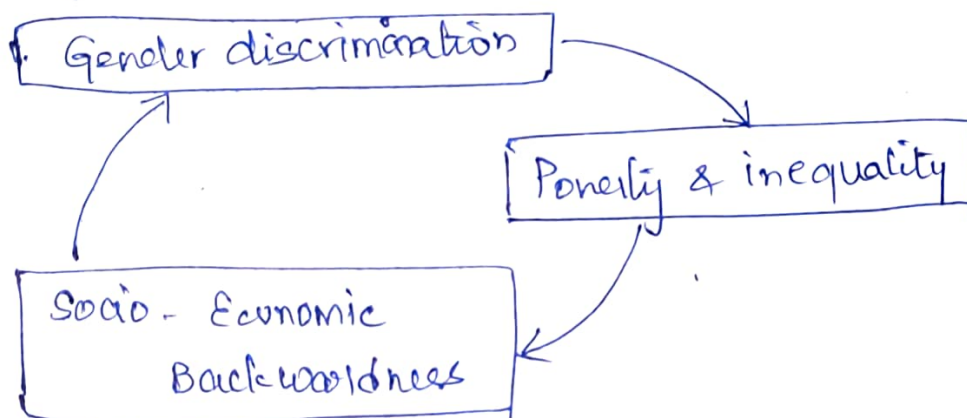


2. Poverty & gender inequality remains the major barrier to eliminate AIDS by 2030. Analyse. (150w)

Elimination of AIDS by 2030:

According to WHO globally 39M people living with HIV and 85.6M have been infected with virus by 2022 needed to be eliminated by 2030 as per UNAIDS target.

Major Barrier to weed out the Disease



i) Gender discrimination:

Among the victim of infection global the treated were men (around 96%), though women (67%) and children at the abyssal 47% remains untreated.

Poverty & inequality:

HIV patients from the poor & marginalised

Communities were stigmatized

→ The UNAIDS report suggests that part of western ^{Asia} Africa & Africa are particularly at high vulnerable.

Socio-Economic backwardness:

The report suggests that women are less likely to be receiving optimal HIV treatment, this can be compared with the labour force participation of women west Asian & African states.

Way forward:

- voluntary contribution of HIV treating drugs by developed nations to WHO
- Gender sensitive approach for vaccination
- Encouraging the victims in social participation to reduce stigma.
