



2. Poverty & gender inequality remains the major barrier to eliminate AIDS by 2030. Analyse. (150w)

### Elimination of AIDS by 2030:

According to WHO globally 39M People living with HIV and 85.6M have been infected with virus by 2022 needed to be eliminated by 2030 as per UNAIDS target.

### Major Barrier to weed out the Disease



#### i) Gender discrimination:

Among the victim of infection global the treated were men (around 76%), though women (67%) and children at the abyssal 4% remain untreated.

#### Poverty & inequality:

HIV patients from the poor & marginalised

Communities were stigmatized

→ The UNAIDS report suggests that part of Western Africa & Africa <sup>Asia</sup> are particularly at high vulnerable.

Socio-Economic backwardness:

The report suggests that women are less likely to be receiving optimal HIV treatment, this can be compared with the labour force participation of women West Asian & African states.

Way forward:

- voluntary contribution of HIV healing drugs by developed nations to WHO
- Gender sensitive approach for vaccination
- Encouraging the victim in social participation to reduce stigma.
