The provisions of the Dam Safety Bill, 2018 will empower the dam safety institutional set-ups in both the centre and state and address all issues concerning dam safety including regular inspection of dams, Emergency Action plan, comprehensive dam safety review, adequate repair and maintenance funds for

dam safety, instrumentation and safety Manuals.

It lays the onus of dam safety on the dam owner and provides for penal provisions for commission and omission of certain acts.

Some state concern that some clauses

will violate the right of that state.

Central government should concern with state government and

their views before legislation on Dam Safety Bill, 2018.
