

14. Guru ka langar which is based on principle of inclusion is an exemplary institution of the moral economy. Explain.

A moral economy is a one based on goodness, fairness and justice. The Guru ka langar which offers an exemplary humanitarian service for satisfying the hunger of people stands as an example for moral economy.

Significance of Guru ka langar :-

* As Sikhism founder Gurmatah's famous slogan of "Service to god as well as humanity", he established langars associated with gurdwaras where the service for human and god can be provided respectively.

* Compassion among the people grown largely was shown by the service of langars amidst the COVID-19 disruption, where people supported the langars with their voluntariness and monetary contribution to make them operate 18 hours a day.

+ Delhi Gurm ka langars satisfies the hunger of vast quarantined migrants, they even reaches the remotest corner of the city through "Meals on wheels Program".

* The Concept of Unity was strengthened by the langars, because people belongs to various Community sat along with each other to have their meals.

- Langars Concept spreads throughout the world, even during the black lives matters protest in US the langars offered the food to the protestors.

Gurm ka langar stands as one of the factor in strengthening the integrity and unity of the nation during the severe crisis period. (Culture of a country seems to be the best defender).
