Ujjwala scheme [PMU4]: providing free LPG

Connections to women from BPL households to reduce health hazards & indoor pollution

Recently the audit of PMU4 by the Comptroller & Auditor general of India highlighted the problems in PMU4.

1. The goal to provide LPG Connections to poor women was patchy. Both in PMU4 & Extended PMU4 [E-PMU4].

2. In PMU4 around 3.5 cr LPG were given

But only 42% were linked.

3. CAG also found in 3.43 Lac Instances LPG distributor had issued 2 to 20 Refills on a day to a single PMUY Beneficiary having a single cylinder connection.
4. Diversion of LPG to Commercial purpose.

5. De-duplication by linking Aadhar.
6. Bank account of others being linked to Ujjwala Beneficiaries

#### Measures:

1. Aadhar linking of all family members of existing as well as new Beneficiaries to ensure de-duplication.
2. Spot checks to see if Intended Beneficiary are diverting LPG to unintended for Commercial purpose.

3. Re-arrange the software at oil marketing companies to add the appropriate input controls in data validation, e-KYC needs to be initiated.

### Conclusion:

Indeed with the effective branding & monitoring, PMUY really has the potential to be transformative.
